Development of Road Around Mountains Asked

Funds Lacking for Lucerne-Twenty-nine Route Surfacing

Proposed to surface the two dirt roads leading from Barstow to Lucerne valley and from Lucerne valley to Twenty-nine Palms was presented to the San Bernardino county board of supervisors yesterday by a delegation of desert and mountain community residents.

Guiding V. Widmore, of Lucerne valley, chairman of the new-formed mountain-equestrian highway improvement committee, and spokesman for the group, told the board that the project would involve surfacing approximately 30 miles of road and would cost an estimated \$300,000 to \$400,000.

TRACK TOURISTS
 The "newest" condition of the tracks forces residents of the Twenty-nine Palms and adjacent desert areas who wish to go to the mountain resorts to drive many miles out of their way. Mr. Widmore stated. He pointed out that improvement of the thoroughfares would also attract many tourists over the back route to the San Bernardino mountains.

The route he termed "one of the most scenic in the country."

La. Cal. R. B. Warren, representing the Marine garage storage and repair depot at Barstow, told supervisors that surfacing of the road from Barstow to Lucerne valley would mean a four-hour reduction in time needed to make routine light-lighting equipment to the mountain area, and a two-hour reduction in the transportation time to reach any places.

FUNDS ALLOCATED
 Board Chairman Frank H. Magly pointed out that any improvement of the roads would be impossible for the current fiscal year, since highway funds have already been allocated. But supervisors might be included in future highway budgets.

Delegates included E. F. Barnes, president of the Barstow member of commerce; Don C. Kirk, president of Diamondstone; E. H. Kelly of Big Bear lake; William E. Miller of Lucerne valley; H. B. Sherman of Twenty-nine Palms; Lieutenant Colonel Wayne and Mr. Widmore.

BLITHE, Oct. 14 (AP)—Wreckage of a Corsair fighter plane was found today in the Chocolate Mountains about 45 miles northwest of Blithe. There was no evidence of a pilot, said Ray H. H. Tull, who made the discovery.
