What's the use in paying high taxes to a County that after it is paid, with a lot thrown in and a fire station built out of people's money to go easy of them, won't give protection for the property the taxes are paid on. That's no desert, but in it same and safe to ask them to do it! North Palm Springs put in their

own fire hydrants, donated a lot. They are located as no other town is to take care of truck fires on so and all the vicinity not protected by Palm Springs. Any live supervisors would see the wisdom of placing a fire station at North Palm Springs and demanding one go in without the people pleading for it. It's a saving to the County they should insist upon but they have been pushing these people back at least 2 years and helping that they haven't any money. What are they doing with the taxpayers' money if they don't have any. What do the people in unincorporated areas get for their money? The tax runs as high as in L.A. but they get something for their money there. It's time for a fire station at North Palm Springs, to protect and save millions of dollars in property. The people should get what they paid for. Let's change it off to error, but let's get that fire station in place for lives and property. These Supervisors are acting with disaster and like kids with matches playing around dynamite don't seem to know it.
