

Group Urges Economy in State Budget

Taft-Hartley Act Changes Opposed by Manufacturers

PALM SPRINGS, Jan. 22. Manufacturers associations in California believe that the latest economy is needed in State spending and, in general, an attempt to bring any change in the Taft-Hartley Labor Law at this time.

That was the essence of two resolutions adopted today by the board of directors of the California Manufacturers Association, spokesmen for manufacturers employing about one-fourth of the workforce in California.

Richard A. Livingston, San Gabriel, president of the manufacturers association, criticized the state budget, which the board of directors, which was organized by "virtually all" of the group's 30 directors.

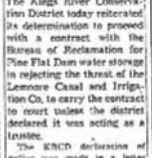
