Forest Service Sets Opening Of Camp Site

The U.S. Forest Service will open the first of a series of camp sites in the Yuca Valley officially open Dogwood Campground, located about one mile southwest of Lake Arrowhead. The entrance to the campground is located at the junction of State Highway 13 and the turnoff to Blue Jay.

The campground facilities, which took over five years of planning and construction in 1962, consist of 40 camp units with 140 bhs and stives, paved roads and parking spaces to accommodate date, races, campers and camp trailers.

It is the first campground in the forest equipped with modern plumbing. Evening information programs will be presented by Forest Rangers as part of the camping program.

A fee of 50 cents per person per day for those over 16 will be charged for using the facilities, however, campers who have purchased the new federal recreation sticker will be admitted without additional charge.

With the opening of Dogwood, the Forest Service will begin work on the transition of Crest Park, campground into a picnic area. Crest Park is located about five miles from the World's high way at the Lake Arrowhead turnoff.

The Crest Park project will involve the Pacific Southwest Forest & Range Department Station, San Bernardino National Forest, and the University of California. In addition to rehabilitating the area, there will be a cooperative study made to develop better methods for planting, managing, and enhancing vegetation on depleted forest recreation sites.

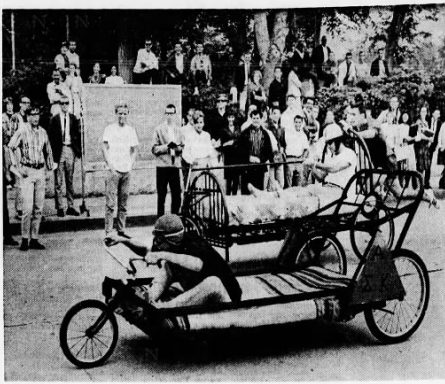
After the project is completed, the entire area will be redesigned with scenic lookout points and new picnic area facilities. Portions of Crest Park will remain open for picnicking throughout the summer season.

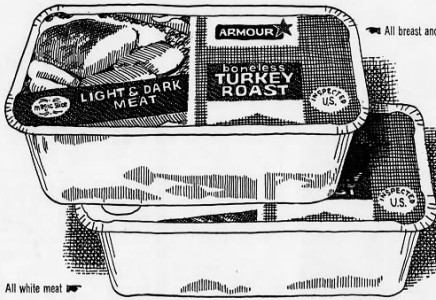
