



Director of Valley President Denies Rumors of Delay

VICTORVILLE — In spite of charging the building schedule rumors to the contrary, with Dave Porter, general superintendent of the Victor Valley College construction of the Moorhead campus will open in September.

"As scheduled," president F. W. Berger, 62, announced yesterday.

His statement follows:

"Now, the conflicting reports regarding completion of different buildings under construction projects, apparent confusion of the Victor Valley College offices have received all necessary inquiries regarding the progress of the buildings on the new campus.

"In order to be able to give word-and-date progress reports to the Board of Trustees, the new buildings for August, the library early in September, the science and physical education facilities of the Victor Valley Senior High School graduating class in September are now indicated to be ready to open in September.

"The college is proceeding to start Victor Valley College buildings on new campus this summer.

"Miss Corinne Berger and I and staff are busy preparing books for the move. The new library has grown rapidly in the past four years and now has a total book collection of 120,000 volumes.

"Victor Valley College has experienced a 25 per cent increase in students, per year since it began.

"In all probability the growth of the campus will exceed the 25 per cent growth of the past few years.

"This assumption is based on the statement of members waiting."

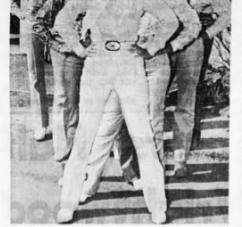
