

## Planners OK Airport, Peril Seen by Aviation Director

Planners yesterday were given the go-ahead by the county aviation director, but the aviation director, novice flyer, later set up trying to get out of there.

## Tax Exemption Forms Go Out to County's Veterans

The applications must be filed with his office by the first Monday in May.

The property to be exempt must be assessed to the veteran or he must produce a copy of the unrecorded purchase contract showing he is responsible for the tax payment, Bevis said.

## Fairway Drive Section Opened

A segment of Fairway Drive between E Street, San Bernardino, and Mt. Vernon Avenue, Colton, closed since last year, was reopened yesterday.

Part of the road that passes through the Warren Creek channel west of the San Bernardino Freeway was washed out by the floods of last December.

Paul J. Young, county supervisor in charge of District 4, announced that repairs have been completed at a cost of some \$20,000.

Young said the county provided fill and pipe at a cost of more than \$2,000, and the City of Colton paved the road at a cost of over \$1,000. Some seasonal work remains to be completed by the county.
