### Attic fire results in \$75,000 in damages

REDLANDS — City inspectors Tuesday sifted through the aftermath of an attic fire that burst through a shake shingle roof resulting in \$75,000 in damages to a south Redlands home.

"We're trying to pinpoint the exact cause," Battalion Chief Ken Darts said. "Right now we're assuming for now that it was a hot water heater."

Three engine companies, a truck company and a rescue unit found flames shooting 15 to 20 feet high when they arrived at 1500 Monticello Court, said Battalion Chief Frank Darks.

No one was injured in Monday's 2 p.m. blaze although neighboring homes were threatened for a time when burning shingles were carried up with the smoke, Darks said.

Two nearby trees caught fire. Damage to the one-story home owned by George Lynch included \$20,000 to the structure and \$25,000 to the contents, a fire department spokesman said. The fire was held at about 12:30 a.m.

# Board delays action on Pioneertown water

SAN BERNARDINO — County supervisors Monday delayed action on Pioneertown's water project after a group of residents expressed concern that the improved water service could supplant the community's Old West character.

The county board, scheduling a decision for 10 a.m. July 11, asked for staff meetings with residents in the meantime to resolve the concern.

Constance Walsh-Hanson, a

spokeswoman for the residents, said they do not oppose growth but are concerned over "how it's going to happen." Merry Uebelacker said they want to protect Pioneertown's historical features.

The \$500,000 project would require private assessments ranging from \$600 to \$1,620 per 1/25 acre to pay off a 34-year loan by the state Department of Water Resources that would finance a replacement of the deteriorated water system.

### San Timoteo contract awarded

SAN BERNARDINO — A \$25,792 contract for installation of rock slopes and other improvements along a 7.6-mile stretch of San Timoteo Creek from Mountain View Avenue to Barton Road in Loma Linda was awarded Monday by the county Board of Supervisors.

The county Flood Control District said the improvements were scheduled because the earthwork creek had become badly eroded. Match Corp. of Colton won the contract with the lowest of seven bids.
