Home Building to Set New Records

NAHB Reports Sharp Increase in Construction

New records for home building are in sight again this year, the National Association of Home Builders reports.

The number of new houses put under construction the first part of this year have outstripped all comparable periods, the Association says. Basing its figures on official Bureau of Labor Statistics reports, the builders estimate that some 357,000 new homes were put under construction in the first five months of 1948. Starts have increased rapidly

since the first of the year. The figures are:

figures are:
January, 50,000; February,
47,200; March, 70,000; April, 90,000 and May, 100,000.
The swift pace is 25% ahead
of last year's record-breaking output. Last year, the remarkable 1.000-000-houses-ayear rate was not attained until fall months This year it was reached in April, according to the NAHB report.

With the speedup of construction, new houses in substantial

volume are being delivered now, with completions rapidly accelerating through the summer months, it was stated.

National Realty Association Head Is Optimistic

Entire real estate outlook heal-thier, with building costs up and possibly headed higher, and with residential shortage still acute.

These are brief summations of main points in a cross-nation re-port by John J. Wagner, presi-dent of the National Association

of Real Estate Brokers.
Other points include larger used homes in good demand, commercial properties sought for investment but few available and office building space tight.

Wagner also noticed mortgage lenders more selective, with shorter terms. He found more selling effort essential. He reports a startling change in the public outlook toward real

estate. An undercurrent of pessi-mism and doubt, which slowed business at the start of 1948, appears to be reversed.

The national preparedness program, believes Wagner, has brought a "new look" to real estate, with prospects for stabilized demand and a high price level seemingly assured for some Demand for new homes, he re-

ports, exceeds that of existing dwellings, with high costs on new construction keeping prices up on existing dwellings.

11 Public Camps Open in Mountains

Riverside County, State

Eleven public campgrounds in the San Jacinto Mountains are now open for summertime use. Seven of the camps are located on Forest Service lands. The reare divided evenly be tween Riverside county and State

Park.

The Forest Service camps are located mainly near the Banning-Idyllwild highway. One of the camps, Pinyon Flats, is at the 4000 foot level on the Pines-to-Palms highway, 15 miles east of Lake Hemet. There is house trailer space. Another Forest camp is established in Tahquitz Valley, at an elevation of 8000 feet. This area is limited to primitive camping only, and can be reached only by trail. reached only by trail.

THE BANNING HIGHWAY THE BANNING HIGHWAY camps are equipped with restrooms, stoves, tables, and fresh water. They range in elevation from 5900 to 7600 feet. Only the Pine Flats camp is suitable for house trailers. All camping is restricted to a 30 day period, except Dark Canyon. Because of the heavy use at this location, camping is limited to 14 days.

Riverside county maintains two camps. One is located at Idyll-wild, and the other at Hurkey Creek, eight miles southeast of Idyllwild on the Pines-to-Palms highway. Elevation is 5300 at Idyllwild, and 4500 at Hurkey creek. There is ample trailer space at both camps.

STATE PARK facilities are confined mainly to the 13 acres in Idyllwild. This camp is equipped for picnics. There is a fee for this camp. According to State Ranger or picnics. There is a fee for this camp. According to State Ranger Bill Weatherbee, the state camp at Round Valley, in the high backcountry, is still in the process of construction. It is limited to primitive camping.
