

Laboratory Balks Errors in Missiles

Pomona Factory Checks Elements of Space Vehicles

BY TED SELL. A quiet, air-conditioned laboratory in Pomona is the scientific factory of the missile age.

The factory is the Western Primary Standards Laboratory, operated by General Dynamics of General Dynamics Corp. under contract to the Navy Bureau of Ordnance.

Basically, WPSL makes standard products to insure that every part of a missile or space-vehicle system is in tune with every other part.

"If they didn't, check could result at every missile launching,"

Products checked. The laboratory checks manufacturer products to insure that every part of a missile or space-vehicle system is in tune with every other part.

One of the companies might be using a radio frequency standard for a train of 15 feet from that of the other company.

Even a small difference would cause a slight error in the flight trajectory of the missile. On a long distance, a tiny error could be critical.

Slight Error. An error of 1 degree in a compass, for example, would mean that the probe wouldn't even come close to the moon.

Discrepancies among manufacturers' standards may be as great as 100 percent.

That convinced the Navy to create a center to check the instruments. The Navy already was operating a western branch of the Naval Ordnance Corps Laboratory at the Pomona site.
