

prop. 9 is 'a disaster' Sims says

Sims says "We're facing a disaster situation in terms of income," Barstow Community College Board of Trustees President Bill Sims said Wednesday. "We simply don't know what to do."

Sims attended a meeting in Sacramento on weekend in which the financial fate of community colleges was discussed. Sims said the state controls 80 percent of the college's funding. "They have eliminated local control, and if they cut the purse strings, they call the money."

Barstow College Superintendent Edwin Spears said earlier this month that administrators are preparing in case Jarvis II is approved by the voters. "Our budgets are being prepared a regular" one based on current totals, one based on a 20 percent cut and a third based on a 30 percent loss.

Sims summed up the situation by saying, "We will have a tremendously adverse effect on community colleges."

Because "wage factors" were used in the fight against Proposition 13, Sims said the public has not been fully aware of the devastation it would bring. "We would probably gain a lot of support."

"At this meeting, the consensus was that we do not have the public willing to attack the colleges or the system. They're just afraid," Sims said. Various state and education officials met in a fire picture at the Sacramento conference.

By mid-1981, the state will be in a deficit spending pattern if other funds are not found. A field representative for State Sen. Alan Rodda presented charts which showed the state will take a huge revenue cut if Jarvis II passes.

"We said several alternatives for coping with large financial cuts were discussed, including charges to state schools and realigning services offered."

"I think we would suffer a great loss in enrollment if we had to charge tuition. Six of our students are part-time and many have jobs."

"I feel the college is representative for State Sen. Rodda. The nearest state college is 70 miles away. If Jarvis II passes, we would suffer as many cuts as we would if this were passed."

The reaction of the federal government was on Sims' mind.

"My concern is how will the federal government help us? We will see if our matching funds" He lamented the fact that the state controls 80 percent of the college's funding.

10 cars on train derailed

DAGGETT — The crew of an out-of-town Union Pacific freight train escaped injury Wednesday when 10 hopper cars derailed near here.
